The Harvest

We are coming into my favorite season of the year – Autumn. The temperature is finally cooler (I love the cold; can't wait for snow!). Soon there will be a burst of color on our trees for a few weeks before all the leaves fall to the ground. And there is the time for harvest.

We prayed for rain – at the right time, in the right amount, in the right places – so that fields could be planted, crops would grow and produce well, and now for the harvest. After months of watching and waiting, there is a burst of activity as the crops are harvested. Many work extra hours. Extra workers are hired. Extra drivers are needed to haul the cargo in trucks and trains. Extra activities (canning, freezing, storing away) as our gardens also come to the end of the growing season

This reminds me of what Jesus said, “The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into the harvest field” (Matthew 9:37-38).

Jesus saw a harvest of people, people longing to hear good news, people ‘ripe’ for the message of salvation. Jesus directs His disciples to pray that the Father, the “Lord of the harvest”, would send more workers. Pray for God to send missionaries/evangelists/disciples to declare His Word.

What I especially love is how quickly God answers those prayers! The very next thing Jesus does (Matthew 10:1-10) is that He sends out the disciples, the ones He just told to **pray for workers**, to go into the ‘harvest’ and **be the workers** telling others of Christ. In Matthew 28, Jesus again sends them, letting them see how big God’s ‘field’ truly is, sending them into “all nations”.

The ‘harvest’ is still great. You also, pray for workers to bring the Gospel into the mission ‘field’ throughout the world. And, don’t be surprised when God ‘sends’ you to a friend, or neighbor, or even around the world, in answer to your prayer. Like the disciples, you know the Master by faith. You know what He has done for you, giving you Life. He has already placed you in the field where you are needed to love others and tell them of the One who loved them and gave His life for them.

As my Mom worked in her garden, whether planting, weeding, or gathering the produce, she would usually bend over at the waste and still hum or sing. She would go out at first light (4:30 in the heart of Summer) and not be back in until the mosquitoes chased her in at the evening. May we have that same joy as we work in the Lord's field. God, by the Holy Spirit working through His Word, will produce a large harvest.

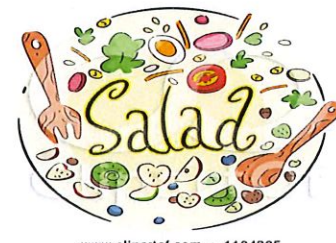
Educational Grants

Stewardship and Debt Reduction

Why is it that every time we go to church they are talking about money? Some people are uncomfortable talking about stewardship, however, we should consider how we manage the gifts we have been blessed to receive from God.

Our health, talent, money, time and abilities are all gifts from God that we are to enjoy and share with God's people. How can we use His gifts to honor Him and help others? The more we give back to Him, the more we receive from Him. That's not why we give but it is how God gives.

God wants us to live abundant lives, but not necessarily with an abundance of "things". God pours out his love on us through Christ and asks us to consider how we can share this wealth with others.

As we contemplate God's love and all He has given us, we need to consider what we can do to return his love with our time, talents and financial resources.

You have probably seen the bulletin information about our rising debt for operational costs of the church and school and the weekly giving falling behind. Some of the shortfall may be due to members missing church due to illness or weather. Some of the reduction in weekly giving may be due to other charitable commitments. However, we do need to consider the financial health of our Church.

It is important that we, as the church, give enough to maintain the church's operation. In this effort, prayerfully consider: making your weekly commitment even when you miss a weekend, consider increasing your weekly donation, and making an additional donation to reduce the operating debt. Debt reduction envelopes will be made available every weekend during October and November. We do not want to be in a position where our expenses out pace our giving and our church no longer can extend our line of credit (borrow) to pay the ongoing bills of the church and school and have to take out a mortgage on our church.

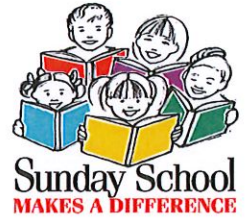


Trunk or Treat

Building on the Cornerstone of Christ

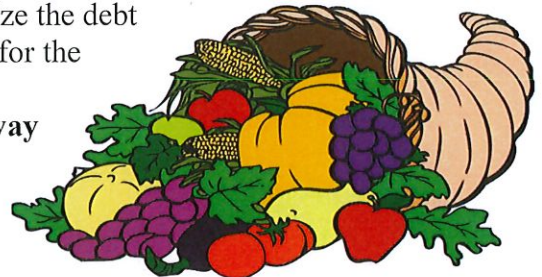

It's in the Way that You Use It

Consider the humble baseball bat. It is a simple tool designed for a complex task. The batter needs a tool that can consistently deliver force to a small ball which may be thrown at over 100 miles per hour, but which might also come slanting across the plate as a slow curve. For a game like this, the founders of baseball had to redesign the old cricket bat, which is more of a flat paddle. The tool had to fit the job.

But even a specially-designed tool can be used for a different purpose. It turns out that some years ago in England, the home of cricket, baseball bats suddenly started selling like hotcakes. What were folks across the pond doing with all those baseball bats? Using them as clubs in riots!

A tool can be used, and it can be misused. It's all in the way that you use it.

The same is true with the things of God. The Second Commandment states that we should "not misuse the name of the Lord." In the Small Catechism, Luther goes on to tell us exactly what this misuse is, as well as the proper use: "We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks." (SC I)

The Lord has given us His name: He has placed it upon us in Holy Baptism and He has invited us to pray to Him as our Father. In this sense, the Lord's name is something for us to use. We should not misuse it ... and we should not fail to use it. The Pharisees of old were so afraid of misusing the name of God that they decided to simply never say the name of God (YHWH, Je-hovah) at all! This non-use is just as bad as misuse. The Lord gives His gifts for our use.

A Christian steward is one who is called to use all of God's gifts for His purposes. This includes things like the Name of God, the Sacraments and the Word, and it also includes things like our family and friends, our talents and skills, our money and resources. Everything that God has given to you, He has given to you so that you may be blessed to use it for His kingdom. It's all in the way that you use it

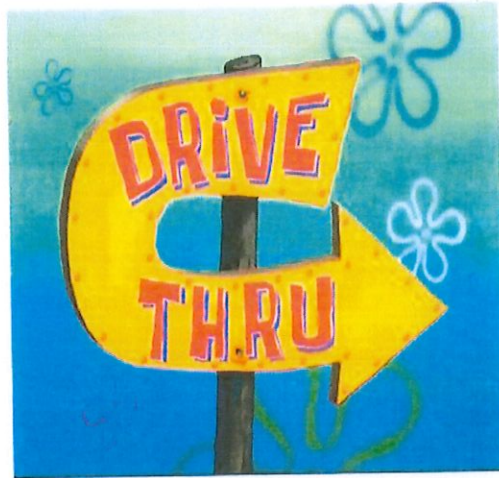
